Each class has a dedicated prayer space that acts as a focal point for class prayer. Children are encouraged to take ownership of this space and change it throughout the year.

As a school we respond through prayer to particular events as they occur. Some will be times of celebrations and some will be times of sorrow. Prayer will act as an opportunity for pupils and staff to come together to express joy and sorrows and be united in prayer.

## The weekly rhythm of our Prayer life:

'Celebration of the Word	This is an opportunity for the school to come together and start the school week by sharing, reflecting and giving meaning to the Gospel Reading of the week. There are opportunities for communal and individual prayers.
Prayer & Praise	We immerse ourselves in God's love through the sharing of music, hymns, communal and individual prayers.
Class Prayers	Pupils and class teachers lead prayer time. Resources to support this include; Ten Ten and CAFOD. During this time children are able to offer their own prayer intentions.
Gift Team led prayers	Linked to the Gospel reading shared during Monday Liturgy, members of the GIFT team support children in further reflection and prayer. There are opportunities for communal and individual prayers.
'Celebration!'	In prayer, we celebrate the gifts that God has given us. We receive a blessing from Father to keep us happy and safe over the weekend ahead. There are opportunities for communal and individual prayers.

**Common Prayers -** We learn prayers 'by heart' so they can spring from the heart.

'For where two or three are gathered in my name, I am there among them' (Matthew 18:20)

**Morning Prayer** - We praise God for the wonders of the new day and God's creation and look ahead to the day with trust in God's guidance.

Grace - Following the Catholic tradition thanking God for the food he provides us and remembering those in need.

**End of Day** - A time for thanksgiving for what God has done for us, a reflection on our day and placing into God's hands our concerns and worries.
