In English, we have started English by exploring The Book of Hopes which is edited by Katherine Rundell. It contains stories from over 100 children's authors and Illustrators, and we will look at various stories so that we can create our own with similar story techniques.

In Maths this term, we will be continuing our Maths scheme, Power Maths. We begin by focusing on Place Value and understanding the importance of number. We will have daily number sessions focusing on times

As scientists we are looking at classifying living things, focusing on our analysing and evaluating skills, as well as learning how to record and present our scientific findings.
