In English this term, we are starting with 'Grimm's Fairy Tales' before moving on to a non fiction text about rocks.

We will be working hard to develop our handwriting, making sure that all our writing has a consistent style. Practicing colouring in and cutting at home really helps develop fine motor skills to aid handwriting.

PE is on Wednesdays and Fridays so your child can wear their kit to school on those days.

Please make sure that all property that is brought into school is named.

In RE we will look at the Creation story and then prepare ourselves for Christmas through Lent.

Our science has begun with rocks, fossils and soil. Then after the half term break we will look into light.

In Humanities we start with 'The United Kingdom' before looking at 'Prehistoric Britain'

Our art is linked to our topic and we will be looking at Neolithic cave art.

Working on our pencil skills, resulting in a large collaborative piece.

Our Music will see the children writing music and then studying music linked to their history topic.

It is vital that you keep in contact with the school through platforms such as Class Dojo as well as Parentpay. The majority of important notices are fed through these platforms. If you need help with these please ask.

In Power Maths, we will start by looking at Place Value, followed by Addition and Subtraction, with Multiplication and Division being looked at after the half term.

In Year Three we need to aim to have learnt our 3,4 and 8 times tables. This follows on from mastering our 2, 5 and 10 times tables in Year Two.

Homework will go out each Friday. This will include the class Guided Reading text, please look at this as it will give your child a head start before the coming week.

Please make sure that reading diaries and school reading book are brought into school each day.

We encourage reading your school reading book a few times at home to build fluency and an expressive story voice. If you would like any more books to share at home please visit the lending library in school or the public library as it is important to develop a love of reading as well as the fundamental skills.
